## **Directors' Message**

#### **Directors' Message**

Launched in July 2023, the Queenscourt Virtual Ward offered a viable alternative to in-patient care (hospital or hospice) for patients living with life-limiting illness who required complex specialist palliative care during acute symptomatic episodes. This important alternative provision helped patients, who would otherwise be in hospital, receive the care and treatment they needed to remain in their own home.

The Virtual Ward was made possible by a collaboration between Queenscourt Hospice and Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Care Board, and during the 12-month funded pilot project, it became a huge success.

The Virtual Ward provided increased capacity within the Specialist Palliative Care Team, and changes to ways of working which enabled #teamqueenscourt to respond to patients in crisis in the community, by providing enhanced support for a short period of time. This had a direct impact on reducing the need for in-patient admission to hospital and our own in-patient unit.

During the 12-month pilot, there were 799 admissions to the Virtual Ward for 488 patients, with only 17 patients requiring hospital admission. As well as enabling patients to remain in their own home, enhancing their quality of life, the estimated cost-saving from avoided hospital admissions and reduced length of stay was millions of pounds.

The positive impact of the project was felt not only by our patients, but also by their families, with one bereaved relative commenting that:

"The Virtual Ward meant the level of support was turned-up every time we needed it, enabling my wife to stay at home"

It is therefore with great sadness that we report that the Virtual Ward closed at the end of August, due to an inability to identify any recurrent funding to contribute to running costs for the service.

The Queenscourt Virtual Ward Pilot has successfully shown the benefits of additional multi-professional working and the impact of increased capacity within the Specialist Palliative Care Service, enabling same-day assessment and enhanced support for patients in crisis, and providing an alternative to hospital admission and use of other urgent care services.

Whilst it is disappointing that we cannot sustain the Virtual Ward, the key learning from the pilot is being used to inform how we are currently working, our strategic planning for the future and our ongoing conversations with commissioners.

It also reinforces to us just how dependant we are on external funding in order to continue delivering the level of exceptional compassionate care that our patients and their families deserve.

The generosity of our wider community is deeply appreciated in this regard, and we would like to thank each and every one of you who help us in whatever way you can - whether it is by a donation, or a gift-in-kind of your time.

It makes all the difference to us.

'Catching the Conversation', equipped hospice volunteers with additional listening skills and knowledge, to support patients and families. Hospice staff mentored them and the University of Edge Hill independently evaluated the project.

One standout example of this mentorship is Julie Davidson, Cross Boundary Education Lead, who works closely with John O'Neill, a longstanding volunteer for Queenscourt. John has taken part in many volunteering roles including working with Queenscourt at Home as well as supporting Star Trekk and Santa Sprint.

Under Julie's guidance, John has gained valuable experience in spending time with patients, offering them companionship and emotional support for a few hours each week.

Through the mentorship programme, John has been trained to pick up on subtle cues in conversations with patients, such as

concerns or anxieties they may be facing. This skill is crucial in providing comfort and addressing



the needs of individuals during sensitive times.

This initiative not only emphasises the importance of education but also highlights the positive impact volunteers can have on the local community. By recruiting and training volunteers like John, Queenscourt Hospice strengthens its mission to provide compassionate care whilst enhancing community involvement.

Hospices participating in this programme are focused on expanding their reach and deepening their connection with the communities they serve, ensuring that more patients receive the vital support they need.

## **Updates from #teamqueenscourt**

#### **Forget-Me-Not Remembering Service**

On June 18th, a Forget-Me-Not remembrance service was held at the West Lancashire Yacht Club in Southport to honour those who had been cared for by #teamqueenscourt and the Palliative Care Service for Southport and West Lancashire over the past six months.

The service, led by Debbie Pierce-Lawson, Director of Corporate Services, brought together family and friends of loved ones who had been lost, along with staff and volunteers from Queenscourt. Attendees gathered not only to pay their respects but also to share in a collective moment of remembrance.

One attendee shared, "It was such a beautiful service. I've never experienced anything like it, and I gained so much from being with others who were also grieving. From the singing to the readings, everything was exceptional, and I'm so grateful for the support shown to me and my daughters."

For many, the event provided a sense of community and comfort. The opportunity to grieve together allowed families to feel that their loved ones were still being remembered, and those unable to attend had the names of their loved ones read aloud, and flowers were placed in their memory.

This service underscores the importance of remembrance, helping families navigate their grief by creating a space where they can reflect and feel supported. The shared experience of honouring those whom we have lost reminds families that their loved ones

### New items purchased with funds raised from Grants & Trusts

This role involves regular telephone contact with patients who have stable disease, offering a comforting and proactive approach to monitoring their condition. By checking in every 4-6 weeks, Angela and the team ensure that any changes in

a patient's health are promptly addressed, with referrals made back to the Community Palliative Care Nurse Specialist when needed.

Angela said: "Queenscourt is a very special place and I feel privileged to work here. It means a lot to me as they have looked after several of my family members,

not only caring for them but supporting us as a family. I feel proud coming to work and I love being part of Queenscourt Connect."



Queenscourt Hospice is delighted to welcome the newest member to the Beehive Family - our mini bee Bumble.

Bumble will play an important role in Queenscourt's Family Support Services, by being available to support children during a challenging time.

Queenscourt Family Support Services consists of specialist Palliative Care Professionals who work with families to support children facing or dealing with the loss of someone close to them. By providing children with a Bumble toy, they will have a special keepsake from Queenscourt that they can hopefully see as a friend to talk to if they are feeling lonely or confused.

#### **Doreen Roberts - Pharmacist**

Doreen Roberts, a Pharmacist specialising in Palliative Care, Medicines Information, and Formulary, joined #teamqueenscourt in May 2023.

Her role, shared between Queenscourt Hospice and Mersey and West Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, focuses on medicine management, safe prescribing, and offering support to patients and their families.

One of Doreen's key responsibilities is advising on managing medications when patients face challenges such as swallowing difficulties, requiring alternative administration methods such as sublingual, buccal, transdermal, or suppository formulations.

"The morning ward rounds at Queenscourt Hospice are the highlight of my day," Doreen shares. "Working alongside doctors and nurses, I get to spend time with patients, helping to manage their symptoms and improve their comfort. It's a privilege to be part of such a compassionate team dedicated to

making a difference to the lives of patients and their families."

In addition to patient care, Doreen contributes to updating medicine guidelines, teaching, and controlled drug stewardship. She began her career as a nurse before transitioning to pharmacy, gaining experience in various healthcare settings both in the UK and abroad



Earlier this year, we had the pleasure of welcoming Dr Hermien Goderie-Plomp and Dr Carla Jufferman's from the Netherlands to Queenscourt Hospice.

#### **Festive Rocky Road Recipe**

#### Easy to make and you can use Christmas leftovers! Ingredients:

100g butter cut into cubes 250g biscuits such as shortbread 75g shelled nuts

100g mixed dried fruit

400g milk or plain chocolate or a mix

140g golden syrup

Sprinkles or sweets to decorate Method:

- biscuits into small pieces
- 2 Halve nuts or chop into small pieces, combine with biscuits and add to bowl
- 3 Melt 300g of chocolate, the butter and golden syrup carefully in a pan set over a low the lovely decorations!

heat stirring occasionally, then pour over the biscuit and nut mixture, mix together and so the chocolate covers everything.

4 Tip the mixture into the tin, then level the top, it doesn't need to be completely smooth. Melt remaining chocolate In microwave in short blasts or in a heatproof bowl over a small simmering pan of water, drizzle this over the top and sprinkle with the decorations. Chill for at least three hours or overnight before 1 Butter and line a 20cm square tin and break cutting into squares. Will keep in fridge for three to four days.




